

In 1979, I wrote an autobiography, published in Korea, titled *Without Sail*. I wrote it to show that I was just like everyone else. I was the first disabled person in Korea to speak publicly about having a disability. The book was adapted into a successful movie. The movie and the book helped establish a disability movement in Korea.

My background is quite varied. I am identified with many different groups. I am proud of my Korean heritage and I wish to retain it, but I am also proud of being an American. I have continued in my determination to disability awareness by opening memberships of the Disabled Students Union (DSU) to all students. In addition, I served as





My first experience with AAC occurred when I met the physicist Dr. Steven Hawking at Berkeley. He used Word + to interact. I used Word+ for IEP meetings and first two weeks of the school year only, because my students did not like it.
